It's been a while...

Hello! Whilst our projects, Shepherds' Rig Wind Farm near Carsphairn and Stroanshalloch Wind Farm near Moniaive, went on hold in 2015, we are moving forwards with them again. An updated scoping report for each was submitted and circulated to consultees in March this year and we have undertaken further survey work.


We'll continue working up the design and layout of each and bring the revised versions to show you at **Community Open Days** on **12**th **and 13**th **September** (details below), before submitting the applications to the relevant authorities later this year.

Overview of the plans

- The number of turbines on each site has been reduced compared to the earlier proposals and would be: Shepherds' Rig – up to 19; Stroanshalloch – up to 7.
- Shepherds' Rig will be a Section 36
 application to the Scottish Government with
 Stroanshalloch a planning application to
 Dumfries & Galloway Council.
- We are developing forest management plans which will help guide the final design layout and turbine size for each site.
- The maximum height to the top of the blades, when one of the blades is in a vertical position, will not exceed 149.9m. At present there are various different turbine types that suit the sites and there may well be others to consider in the future.
- Community Open Days will take place between 2pm and 7pm on Wednesday 12th September in the Lagwyne Hall in Carsphairn and Thursday 13th September at the Glencairn Memorial Institute in Moniaive.
- **Submission** of the applications is expected in the Autumn of 2018.

Overview of the plans

- 3 sites: Shepherds' Rig near Carsphairn,
 Stroanshalloch near Moniaive and Marnhoul near Corsock.
- Shepherds' Rig will be a Section 36 application to the Scottish Government with Stroanshalloch and Marnhoul Major Applications to Dumfries & Galloway Council.
- The maximum number of turbines on each site would be: Shepherds' Rig – up to 45;
 Stroanshalloch/ Marnhoul – up to 16 each.
- We are currently developing forest management plans which will guide the final design layout and turbine size for each site.
- The scoping report states that the maximum height to the top of the blades, when one of the blades is in a vertical position, will not exceed 146.5 metres. At present there are various different turbine types that suit the sites and there may well be others to consider in the future.
- **Community Open Days** on 22nd, 23rd and 24th July to present proposals and receive feedback. We will consult again with local people before applications are submitted.
- **Submission** of the planning applications is expected in early 2014.
